MINUTES

FRIENDS OF THE LIBRARY

April 20, 2016

President LaMesa Yarborough called the meeting to order.

Present: LaMesa Yarborough, Tammy Zecca, Sam Harlan, Martha Young, Joseph Marsh, Margaret Schwabe, and Andrew Peppers.

A quorum was declared present.

Library Director Martha Young gave the invocation.

Minutes of the January 2016 meeting were read. Motion to approve was made by LaMesa, seconded by Tammy, passed.

The Treasurer's Report as of January 2016 was read. Motion to approve by LaMesa, seconded by Sam Harlan., passed.

Joseph Marsh gave a report on the quote received from Bibliotheca for the Security System/Gates for the library. The quote was for \$44,082.00, a substantial increase from the previous quote given in 2015. The quote includes a one year warranty, training for library Staff by the company. Several issues were discussed. Further inquiries are to be made by the library staff as to maintenance of the gates/system, length of warranty (one year seemed very short for the cost of the system), and the cost of \$2,561.00 for shipping, handling, and administration as included in the quote. A decision as to the purchase was therefore tabled until additional information is available. A special meeting may be called, if necessary to discuss any further information received prior to the next scheduled regular meeting.

Martha disturbed the library reports as to attendance and game room activities.

The 2016 Summer Reading Program was discussed. This year's theme is fitness and three activities are scheduled. They are to be advertised in the local newspapers, radio, and flyers posted around town. There will be more but smaller prizes to be able to have more winners.

There being no more business, LaMesa made the motion to adjourn, seconded by Tammy.

Summer Reading Program:

June 2016

Margaret Carder Library's "Ready, Set, Read!" Summer Reading Program has come to an end. What a joy it has been, seeing the growth of so many children reaching a higher level in their reading. There were 46 children that attended our summer reading presentations. The theme of the year's Summer Reading Program was Getting Active.



The first program was a “Boffer Battle Royale.” A boffer is a simple and safe homemade foam sword. After teaching the kids how to make their own boffers, and explaining boffer safety, we began a double-elimination tournament. After the winner was named, we broke the kids into two groups for a team battle, then we finished up with a free-for-all melee. However, we had a little bit of time left over, so we orchestrated one final battle: all the kids vs. the Library staff. While our staff fought valiantly, they were quickly overwhelmed by the horde of kids.



Our second program was “Great Group Games,” in which we led the kids through a variety of games. We started off with a game called Brave/Bow/Buffalo, which is essentially a sort of team Rock/Paper/Scissors, crossed with Tag and Red Rover. Next, we played Dragon’s Tail Tag, in which the kids lined up holding the shoulders of the kid in front of them, and the kid in the front tries to tag the kid in the back who is trying to avoid being tagged. Next, we played a variety of Parachute games with a big 24 foot parachute, and finished up with a couple games of dodgeball.

Our final Program was called Wet and Wild. This is where we had all of our water based games. It was a great way to cool off during a very hot week. We had Water races and relays. We had a couple rounds of a water balloon tosses, and water balloon hot potato. However, the major event was a huge water balloon fight, in which the kids battled it out using over a thousand balloons. Needless to say, by the end we were all very wet.

Cable One is now the Margaret Carder Library internet server with 100 Mbps speed for the amount of \$139.50 a month.
