Scavenger Hunt Hosted by the Margaret Carder Library

The legend of the lost original 1613 play script, “King Henry VIII,” by William Shakespeare, has been passed down from generation to generation but the play itself has not been found. William Shakespeare never published any of his plays and therefore none of the original manuscripts have survived except for this one. The original actors of “King Henry VIII” had this play published 7 years after his death.

It all began May 10, 1899, in Stratford-upon-Avon in England, with a unique pioneer, John Landenberg, from Greer County, Texas. He was the towns wealthiest man who had a side-job of collecting rare manuscripts and autograph books worth millions. Landenberg became the possessor of the play script, “King Henry VIII” by William Shakespeare.

On October 10, 1910, John Landenberg, to his horror, discovered the manuscript was missing.

Now, get ready for the thrill of competition.

You are cordially invited to a scavenger hunt -hosted by Margaret Carder Library and the Southwest Oklahoma Writers League - to locate the lost manuscript.

You will have three weeks, beginning Wednesday, April 14th, to find the lost script of “King Henry VIII” here in our community. The first clue will be posted in the “Mangum Star” and The Enterpriser on April 14th. When you find the first article, you will receive a custom-made ticket with the next clue. When you find “King Henry VIII,” the final article, bring your tickets to the Margaret Carder Library. Your tickets will be put into the drawing for the prizes. On Monday, May 10, 2010, the winner will be announced at the brown-bag luncheon at the Margaret Carder Library.

Christian-fiction author Terrye Robins will be the guest speaker at a brown-bag luncheon at the Margaret Carder Library located at 201 W. Lincoln in Mangum on Mon., May 10th at noon. The public is invited to bring a lunch and come and hear her lively presentation.

Drinks and dessert will be provided. As a part of the mystery scavenger hunt hosted by the library, Terrye will be greeting guests and sharing information about her writing career and her humorous mystery novels, *Trouble in Paradise*, *Revenge in Paradise*, and the newest addition, *Justice in Paradise*. A question and answer session will follow, and books will be available there for purchase. Terrye will be at the library until 2:00 p.m. to accommodate anyone who can't make it to the luncheon.
